

Guide for Authors

“Latvian Journal of Physics and Technical Sciences”

“Latvian Journal of Physics and Technical Sciences” (hereafter – LJPTS) considers for publication original scientific or engineering research papers concerned with any aspect of the following topics:

- Energy and Power,
- Physical Sciences,
- Physics and Applied Physics in Engineering,
- Environmental Physics and Biotechnology.

1) LJPTS operates a Blind Peer Review process.

- All contributions will be initially assessed by the Editor. Papers deemed suitable are then sent to independent expert reviewers to assess the scientific quality of the paper.
- The Editor is responsible for the final decision regarding acceptance or rejection of articles. The Editor's decision is final.

2) Papers should occupy:

- not more than 15 printed pages (A4),
- figures, tables, and references should occupy not more than 7 printed pages.

3) The paper should be prepared with the text editor WORD for Windows.

4) Margins should be of a Normal template:

- Top – 1 inch,
- Bottom – 1 inch,
- Left – 1.25 inches,
- Right – 1.25 inches.

5) Following font, letter size and line spacing should be used:

- Times New Roman,
- 11– point (pt) letter size,
- single line spacing.

- 6) Following letter sizes for formulae according to MathType 6.0 Equation should be used:
- Full 11 pt
 - Subscript/Superscript 8 pt
 - Sub-Subscript/Superscript 6 pt
 - Symbol 11 pt
 - Sub-symbol 8 pt
- 7) Figures should be computer-composed.
- 8) Tables should be numbered in a sequence corresponding to the order of citation in the text and a short heading should accompany each table.
- 9) The title page should contain the title of research, name(s) and affiliation(s) of author(s), and e-mail address of corresponding author (see: *Sample*).

- 10) Text of the paper should normally be organized as follows:
- Abstract (the word “Abstract” is not written) with key words (max 7),
 - In Abstract no references, graphical information (tables, figures) mathematical expressions etc. should be included.
 - Introduction,
 - Experimental (or Theory),
 - Results,
 - Discussion (or Results and Discussion),
 - Conclusion(s),
 - References.

- 11) For submitted papers both the British (UK) and the American spelling is accepted, provided the usage consistency is observed throughout the text. The computer spell-checking is highly recommended.
- 12) References in the text should be given as numbers in square brackets [...] and listed in numerical order at the end of the typescript.
 - Examples of published reference are as follows (Format (APA Style)).

Author(s). (Year of publication). Article title. Journal Title. Volume (issue), range of pages.
